REQUEST FOR FURTHER DISCUSSION OF THE PLASTIC BOTTLE POLICY

Ivan Yee appeared on behalf of Oriental Gardens. He would like to have the restraint of non-glass containers lifted. Captain Robert Pistone of the Haverhill Police Department spoke about this issue. At the last meeting, the License Commission suggested that Mr. Yee contact the Haverhill Police Department to discuss the safety plan. He has not contacted them yet. Having a liquor license is a privilege and the police department understands that things happen when establishments have liquor licenses. When things happen, they look for cooperation from the establishment. There have been two incidents that occurred in the area of Oriental Gardens and their camera system would be helpful to the investigation and the on-duty manager was not cooperative. They would not contact Mr. Yee. There is limited access to the camera system. There was much discussion on the cooperation issue and the retention of the video. Commissioner Coco requested that Mr. Yee work with the police department on the video and come to an agreement on the video issue. He would also like to see someone on duty who can act in the absence of Mr. Yee. He would also suggest that there be a contact number located in the establishment where Mr. Yee could be reached at any time during business hours. The Commissioners agreed to place this item on the agenda for next month and to consider his request regarding the non-glass container ruling at that time.

B. DISCUSSION OF CARRY-IN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES LICENSE AND REGULATIONS FOR THE SAME

Commissioner Coco addressed where the License Commission stands on this matter. They do not have the authority to regulate the Carry In License. The License Commission will request permission from the City Council and the Mayor to allow the License Commission to regulate these licenses. Shawna Kelley appeared and wanted to make sure that cultural and arts are included in the new regulations. Sharon Cohen appeared and stated the only concern was that the licenses were regulated and it appeared that the Commission was regulating them. Commissioner Coco asked any business owner to hold off doing anything with regard to Carry In alcohol until the License Commission can put the regulations into place. Motion that the License Commission send a letter to the Haverhill City Council and the Mayor requesting permission to allow the Haverhill License Commission to regulate Carry In Licenses made by Commissioner Coco, seconded by Commissioner Sewell. No public comment on this matter. Vote unanimous, motion passed.

Jean-Pierre Saliba appeared on behalf of the applicant. Captain Robert Pistone of the Haverhill Police Department addressed the Commission on behalf of both the fire department and the police department. Customers continue to park on Route 110. There is no designation of employee and customer parking. He has failed to comply with requests made in March. The recommendation is to reduce the amount of spaces for sales of cars and increase customer and employee parking out front with appropriate signage. Do not renew the license until he complies or renew it for 30 days and revisit the issue. Mr. Saliba indicated he has moved the cars and made room. He has no control over the customers parking on Route 110. He needs his license to continue his financial and auction obligations. Motion to renew the license on an interim basis pending the outcome of the compliance measures as confirmed by the Haverhill Police Department and the Haverhill Fire Department, made by Commissioner Coco, seconded by Commissioner Sewell. No public comment on this matter. Vote unanimous, motion passed.
