SHOW CAUSE HEARING – ALLEGED VIOLATION OF 204 CMR 2.05 (2) PERMITTING AN ILLEGALITY ON THE LICENSED PREMISES, TO WIT: (2) NO LICENSEE FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES SHALL PERMIT ANY DISORDER, DISTURBANCE OR ILLEGALITY OF ANY KIND TO THE PLACE IN OR ON THE LICENSED PREMISES. Steven Santoro and Attorney Tim Connors appeared on behalf of the establishment. Due to information received on the morning of May 5 2016, Chairman Edwards opened this item as an item for discussion only. Captain Robert Pistone of the Haverhill Police department stated that the establishment was originally sited for failure to notify the police and failure to facilitate medical aid, but it was learned that in fact the establishment had flagged down a police officer who was driving by at the time of the incident. That officer did not file a report. The only issue left is over serving. The Haverhill Police would like to know the best practices of the establishment for the safety of the patrons. Steven Santoro, one of the owners of the establishment gave a description of the incident and what he and his staff did during this incident. They now have five to six doormen on duty on Friday and Saturday nights. All was in line with what the police would like to see happen in these circumstances. The Commissioners had a few questions of Mr. Santoro and cautioned him to watch the crowd. Chairman Edwards also inquired about the patio and the security on the patio. Motion to take no action on the matter, being an item for discussion, made by Commissioner Sewell, seconded by Commissioner Coco. No public comment on this matter. Vote unanimous, motion passed.
