AN ORDINANCE RELATED TO PROHIBITED TURNS

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Haverhill that Chapter 240, of the Haverhill City Code Chapter 240-91, Schedule H: Prohibited Turns, as amended, be further amended as follows:

By adding the following:
