Residents Answer Mayor's Call to Serve on City Boards

A month ago, Mayor James J. Fiorentini asked for residents to serve as volunteers on City Boards and Committees and many residents responded. Today, Mayor Fiorentini announced the newly appointed members. Last Tuesday, the Haverhill City Council confirmed Haverhill for Hunking co-chairperson Karen Peugh as the newest member of the Planning Board for a five-year term. In cities, the Planning Board is appointed by the mayor and subject to confirmation by the city council. In addition, Mayor Fiorentini reinstated a five-member Recycling Advisory Committee.
