Solicitor Cox consulted with the State Ethics Commission with regard to the City Council voting on this ordinance. Solicitor Cox explained that it was his understanding that there was a conflict of interest as each Councilor is a member of the Haverhill Retirement System and the proposed ordinance would increase the amount of retirement contributions from them, that where all Councilors are retirement members the Council lacks a quorum because of conflicts of interest, that there is a legal requirement that the Council

act as they need to comply with IRS regulations concerning payment of compensation, that only the Council can enact ordinances as provided for by the Charter, that the Council is acting on advice of counsel, and that the Council is able to vote on the matter because of the rule of necessity. The ordinance incorporates the expenses into Council salary. It does not increase their annual pay. PRESIDENT MICHITSON INVOKED THE RULE OF NÉCESSITY PASSED
