8. Hearings and Related Orders

Hearing was held on Document 89, petition for Special Permit from Attorney Michael Migliori for owner/applicant, Bread & Roses Housing Inc. requesting to construct 10 residential units to be owner-occupied located on 432 Washington st/0 Gilbert av; Assessor's Map 503-236-6, 7,8,8A and 12A – which is located in the "RU" District. Favorable conditional recommendation was received from Planning Board & Planning Director.

President Michitson opened the hearing. Attorney Migliori informed that the site is the vacant St. George's Church. Bread & Roses purchased the site last year. The site has become a blight in the Mt. Washington neighborhood. The proposal is for the construction of 10 residential units to be owner-occupied. The units will have an affordability restriction on them in perpetuity. Yessenia Gil, Bread & Roses Executive Director spoke about their mission and how it relates to the neighborhood. The building will be torn down because of its deteriorated state. A parcel was purchased at 0 Gilbert Ave. to be used as green space. Units will be townhouse style, which are targeted to first time home buyers. They have done extensive outreach working with the Mt. Washington Alliance and Urban Kindness. Ms. Gil also spoke about the selection process.

Speaking in favor were Christine Soundara, Director, Mt. Washington Alliance, Keith Boucher, Chair, Urban Kindness, John Cuneo, Director, Community Action and resident Nick Golden. Andrew Herlihy, CDBG Director, informed that a special focus will be made for local Haverhill residents. Joseph Levis and Matt Provencher from the development team answered questions. Hearing closed.
