10.1. <u>Document 79</u>: Water Street Redevelopment LLC requests Special Permit, CCSP-21-12, for redevelopment of Property at 85 Water st. consisting of 113 rental units on 1.19 acres+. This property is within the Waterfront Zoning District ,Sub-Zone D. Comments from Planning Director, William Pillsbury and City Depts are included

Council President Barrett opened the special permit hearing.

Attending the hearing in person to give the presentation and overview of the project is John McCarthy, Minco Development Corp., North Andover, for the applicant. Also in attendance are Louis Minicucci, Eric Loth, Robert Lavoie, Scott Cameron, Michael Radner, Gregory Smith, Christopher Wilson, Karen Pollastrino and Frank Franzone.

Council President Barrett asked if anyone wanted to speak in favor.

Mike Harrington, 640 Boxford Rd., believe it's a good project, lot has been vacant for over 15 years and if isn't approved afraid will stay vacant; no impact on school with studios; housing for young adults is important.

Reginald King, grew up in Haverhill, not happy citizens can't be on the water, likes the building but the park is too small.

Council President Barrett asked if anyone would like to speak in opposition.

Tim Carroll, Union President Local 1011 Fire Fighters spoke not in either opposition or favor but more indifference. Concerned about the number of approved units with no increase in staffing for public safety, firefighters, and police.

Angelo Petrozzelli, 85 Brockton Ave. called in opposition stating he thinks the building should be rethought out, it's a barrier to the river view, and the density is too dense.

Council President Barrett closed the hearing.

Councillor LePage is requesting a progress update on the City's efforts of promoting the MassSaves Energy efficiency program for the benefits of residents, a progress update on the Green Communities grant application and follow up on the City Council request of re-establishing the Mayor's Sustainability Advisory Committee

Chief of Staff Allison Heartquist: Green Communities update, completed round 1, had green communities visit to inspect projects which included energy efficient led lights at multiple



schools and city buildings, kitchens upgrades at Haverhill High School, two electricity transformers at city hall, an electric vehicle or inspections office and an e-bike for the Police dept. Now moved to round 2, grant applicant is due October 8^{th,} very competitive round, not automatic funding and worth up to \$200K. Our energy manager is working on the application which is mainly weatherization project such as heaters, boilers, more electric vehicles, etc.

LePage: Update on MassSaves Efficiency program. For those who don't know, this program is part of your electric bill

Heartquist: The city has partnered with All In Energy. The city can earn up to grant funding up to 20K if we can achieve 10-15% increase over our 2017-2019 participation rates. Feedback on Goals: August 31 residential energy assessments 27% towards goal would like 271 only have 74. Small business: have 91 goal was 26 - 350% on way to goal. Heating and cooling goal is 542 we are 54% there. Weatherization: want 839 only 31% way there. Information can be found for Haverhill energy campaign at Masssave.com. Closes in December
