#### PRESIDENT SULLIVAN OPENED THE HEARING

MAYOR BARRETT ADDRESSED THE COUNCIL. SHE STATED WHEN WE MET TO SET THE FY25 BUDGETWE KNEW THIS WOULD RESULT IN AINCREASED TAX BILL DUE TO A NUMBER OF FACTORS INCLUDING SETTLMENTS OF LONG OUTSTANDING COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENTS THE DEBT SERVICE ASSOCIATED WITH CONSENTINO SCHOOL AND THE DECISION TO ADHERE TO THE CITY'S FINANCIAL POLICIES. AT THAT TIME WE HAD ESTIMATED THAT THE AVERAGE SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENCE TAX BILL WOULD INCREASE BY \$440.00. THIS ESTIMATE WAS BASED ON ADOPTED FISCAL YEAR 25 BUDGET AND LAST YEAR'S VALULATIONS CERTIFIED BY THE DEPT OF REVENUE (DOR). SINCE THAT TIME THE DOR HAS CERTIFIED THE VALUATIONS IN ANTICIPATION OF THIS HEARING FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE 2018 COMMERICAL AND INDUSTRIAL VALUATIONS HAVE OUTPACED SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENCE VALUATION. THUS, THE PROJECTED INCREASE OF \$440.00 FOR A SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENCE HAS DROPPED TO \$365.00. SHE STATED I DO BELIEVE SOME SHIFT SHOULD BE CONDISDERED.

CHRIS WEBB, CITY ASSESSOR ADDRESSED THE COUNCIL. SHE WAS JOINED BY STEPHEN GULLO AND ROY WRIGHT OF THE BOARD OF ASSESSORS AND THANKED THEM FOR THEIR HELP. SHE TOOK THE OPPORTUNITY TO THANK HER STAFF, SUE POWELL, DANIELLA CEDARMAN AND LAURIE CREVATIS. SHE STATED THAT THEY SUBMITTED THEIR WORK TO THE DOR FOR THIS INTERIM VALUATION YEAR AND THEY HAVE THOROUGHLY REVIEWED AND APPROVED OUR NEW VALUES AND NEW GROWTH. AND GIVEN US THE GO AHEAD TO CONDUCT TONIGHT'S PUBLIC HEARING IN CONFORMANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF CHAPTER 369 OF THE ACTS OF 1982. TONIGHT, YOU WILL BE ASKED TO VOTE ON THE SEPARATE ITEMS. A MINIMUM RESIDENTIAL FACTOR, A SMALL COMMERICAL EXEMPTION, A RESIDENTIAL EXEMPTION, AN OPEN SPACE DISCOUNT, PERMANENT CPI INDEX, AND ANNUAL CPI. SHE GAVE A POWER POINT PRESENTATION.

KATE MARTIN, INTERIM PRESIDENT OF GREATER HAVERHILL CHAMBER OF COMMERCE. SHE STATED LARGE PROJECTS FOR HOUSING HAVE BEEN APPROVED IN HAVERHILL. 89% OF HAVERHILL IS RESIDENTIAL. SHE MENTIONS THAT THE 16,000 S/F HAVERHILL'S WELCOME CENTER WILL OPEN IN 2025. SHE MENTIONS THIS BECAUSE ITS AN INCREDIABLE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMET DRIVER. HAVERHILL'S MASTERPLAN CALLS FOR EXPANDING THE CITY'S TAX BASE AND CREATING JOBS. SHE WOULD LIKE THE COMMERCIAL TAX RATE TO STAY STEADY AT 165.

JEFF LINEHAN ADDRESSED THE COUNCIL ON BEHALF OF THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE. HE STATED HE WOULD LIKE TO HOLD THE RATE AT 165. HE NOTED THAT WE NEED MORE JOBS HERE AND COMMERCAL PROPERTY FOR THOSE JOBS. IT COSTS MORE TO OWN COMMERCIAL PROPERTY HERE. GOING ABOVE 165 TAXRATE WILL NOT ALLOW US TO BE COMPETITIVE. HAVING BUSINESS IN HAVERHILL IS A GIFT TO THE RESIDENTIAL TAXPAYERS.

#### PRESIDENT ASKED IF ANYONE WOULD LIKE SPEAK ON THIS MATTER?

CHRIS WEBB STATED THERE ARE SEVERAL REAL ESTATE EXEMPTIONS INCLUDING ELDERLY, WIDOW/WIDOWER, BLIND, AND VETERAN DISABLED. VICE PRESIDENT JORDAN STATED THAT HIS MOTION WILL BE TO KEEP THE RATE WHERE IT CURRENTLY IS. HE STATED IT IS EXPENSIVE TO RUN A CITY. HE NOTED THAT BUSINESSES USE LESS CITY SERVICES AND RIGHT NOW THE BUSINESSES ARE PAYING 65% MORE IN TAXES. HE ALSO NOTED THAT BUSINESSES GIVE BACK TO LOCAL NON-PROFITS. HE STATED IF WE STAY AT 165 SINGLE FAMILY HOMES WILL HAVE A 7% INCREASE, BUSINESSES 8% AND INDUSTRIAL 7%, ON A PERCENTAGE LEVEL THAT IS COMPARABLE.

MOTION BY VICE PRESIDENT JORDAN TO KEEP THE RESIDENTIAL RATE AT .9099, SECOND BY COUNCILOR MICHITSON

COUNCILOR MICHITSON STATED HE TOOK A CLOSE LOOK AT WHAT IS HIS PRINCIPLE WHICH WOULD BE TO HAVE IT AT 165 VERSES A TEMPORARY BAND-AID. HAVERHILL NEEDS A STRONG BUSINESS BASE. BUSINESSES PROVIDE JOBS, INTERNSHIPS, AND FUNDING TO NON-PROFITS. IN ORDER TO ADDRESS THE NEW FACILITIES AND INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS NEED TO EXPAND TAX BASE.

COUNCILOR TOOHEY STATED HE IS ON THE OTHER SIDE OF HIS COLLEAGUES. HE HEARS ABOUT HOW CHALLENGING THESE INFLATIONARY TIMES ARE. HE WILL NOT SUPPORT 165. HE BELIEVES THAT WE NEED TO GIVE THE RESIDENTIAL SIDE A TAX BREAK. IN MY WARD THE HOUSES ARE \$900,000 HOMES THE TAX BILL WOULD BE APPROXIMATELY \$9,600.00. HE ASKED MAYOR WHAT SHE THOUGHT WOULD BE ADEQUATE FOR A FACTOR.

MAYOR BARRETT STATED SHE THINKS 165 SOUNDS REASONABLE. SHE WOULD ASK THAT YOU CONSIDER SOMEWHERE IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD OF 170.

COUNCILOR TOOHEY STATED DURING THE BUDGET PROCESS WE TALKED ABOUT TAXES AND YOU SAID WE COULD TALK ABOUT AN ADJUSTMENT. COUNCILOR TOOHEY ASKED THE MAYOR HOW MUCH WAS CERTIFIED IN FREE CASH?

MAYOR BARRETT RESPONDED 9.7 CERTIFIED. MUCH OF THAT MONEY IS SPOKEN FOR. WE ARE SPENDING 14% LESS THIS YEAR OF OUR FREE CASH. WE COULDN'T TAKE IT ALL BACK. WE FINANCED THE LAST YEAR OF THE TEACHER'S RAISES.

COUNCILOR TOOHEY STATED 170 IF IT WAS SUPPORTED AND VOTED ON WOULD APPROXIMATELY BE \$34.00 A WEEK FOR COMMERCIAL INCREASE.

COUNCILOR MCGONAGLE STATED HE AGREED WITH ALL THE COUNCILORS BUT HE TENDS TO SIDE WITH VICE PRESIDENT JORDAN AND COUNCILOR MICHITSON. HE FEELS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT WILL GET US OUT OF THIS. WE HAVETO TRY TO FIND A WAY TO GET MORE BUSINESSES. HE BELIEVES THAT 165 IS FAIR. WE DO HAVE PROGRAMS FOR PEOPLE ON FIXED INCOMES.

COUNCILOR LEWANDOWSKI STATED SHE WILL BE VOTING FOR 165 BECAUSE SHE BELIEVES IN BUILDING OUR COMMERCIAL BASE. COMING DOWN THE PIPE THERE WILL BE FUNDS THAT WON'T BE AVAILABLE AND THESE BUSINESS GIVE TO LOCAL NON-PROFITS TO HELP WITH THINGS LIKE THE TURF AT THE STADIUM, MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAMS AND AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS. IT IS DIFFICULT BECAUSE IT EFFECTS OUR LIVES AND PEOPLE THAT ARE CLOSE TO US.

COUNCILOR BASILIERE STATED HE HAD PHONE CALLS WITH THE VICE PRESIDENT, PRESIDENT, COUNCILOR TOOHEY AND THE MAYOR'S OFFICE. HE NOTED THAT HE WENT OUT AND SPOKE WITH THE RESIDENTS OF WARD 1 AND THEY ARE UNDER STRAIN. HE ALSO NOTED THAT 495 IS THE SECOND LARGEST BELTWAY IN THE UNITED STATES AND WE HAVE 5 EXITS ON THAT. I FEEL OUR GEOGRAPHY IS GOOD FOR BUSINESSES BEING PRICED OUT OF OTHER COMMUNITIES. I AM LOOKING FOR A COMPROMISE.
