6.2 Order – to Authorize Acquisition of Land in Connection with the Crystal Street/Jericho Road Conservation Project

Related communication from Robert E. Ward, DPW Director

Robert Ward, DPW Director, addressed the Council stating this order is to authorize the Mayor to acquire land for water supply protection, conservation, and passive recreation. It is an eminent domain taking but a friendly one. The seller has agreed to the price and will not appeal. It is appraised at \$565K. A land grant of \$404K, and water paying \$180K of difference. It is 35 acres of land on Crystal Street. Grant is a conversation grant which Rob Moore did all the work on. It will have a conservation restriction with Essex Green Belt.

6.3 Order – authorize Mayor to sign Memorandum of Agreement by and between City of Haverhill and Essex County Greenbelt Association Inc – Conservation Restriction Approval – Land off Hannan Ridge Rd – Parcel 586-431-18A

Related communication from Robert E Moore Jr, Environmental Health Technician

Robert Ward, DPW Director, addressed the Council stating the parcel of land is on the back side of Parsonage Hill Road. Vanessa from Essex Green Belt knows the details.

Vanessa Johnson Hall, Essex Green Belt, addressed the Council stating there are two documents. One is a MOU and the other is approval to sign. The parcel is 59.6 acres adjacent to a piece of land Greenbelt has had since the 90's which is land locked and will allow to open new conservation area. Part of the funding package is grant applied for conservation restriction of \$320K, and land grant allows for 68% of purchase price reimbursed of \$217,600. Have to show the State proof for grant. Greenbelt will grant \$102,400 to the city so only have to pays what's granted from the State. Conservation restriction has been reviewed by

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the city attorneys, city, and the State and approved for signatures. One MAJOR error on page 1 which says the "conservation restriction is being granted for a nominal consideration" in fact it actually should say being granted for "\$320K". If vote tonight could acknowledge that change, I can correct it.
