Bruce Haskell, Langan Environmental, presented the regulations, technical specifications, schedule, and cost sharing for capping the landfill.

16.2. <u>Document 61-G</u>; Councillors Bevilacqua and Toohey request a discussion regarding conditions local roads are in after excavation

Councillor Bevilacqua explained an issue for a while but recently on Carleton Street where damage was done to vehicle from being left in bad condition after work being done. Also makes it a dangerous situation for drivers. Would like a better and quicker system for repairs.

Councillor Toohey also expressed concern with the way the roads are left after construction. Witnessed a bus having to drive on the opposite side of the road to avoid torn up road, asked what can be done.

Robert Ward took blame on delay on Carleton Street due to paving prices being too high to do a small patch. Will be done 2nd week of July. City paving is almost entirely Chapter 90 money which is not released until July 1st. In a holding pattern until money is released. There are city specifications as far as compaction and what is put back on the road. City is low on inspectors. State supplementing chapter 90 with WRAP program.

Councillor Bevilacqua stated he received multiple complaints from citizens about the conditions of the planters. Know the city is planning on buying new planters.
