Conservation Restriction granted from Greenbelt to BTA/BOLT, Inc.

The Bailey Farm property provides significant ecological, scenic, and recreational values to our community. It embodies the rural, forested character of not only this area of Haverhill, but of the region. This Conservation Restriction contributes to the protection of these values, while creating new, public opportunities for passive recreation, education, and nature study, including public trail and non-motorized, car-top boat access to Chadwick Pond.

The Conservation Commission, at its meeting on July 13, 2017, reviewed this Conservation Restriction and voted in favor of signing the Municipal Certification, which details the public interests in the property. On behalf of the Commission, I recommend and support the Mayor and Council approving this Restriction.

MUNICIPAL CERTIFICATION Greenbelt Conservation Restriction Kingsbury Ave., Haverhill

We, the undersigned Conservation Commission of the City of Haverhill hereby certify that the proposed Conservation Restriction from Greenbelt to BTA/BOLT, Inc. is in the public interest in that:

- The property protects outdoor recreational, significant natural habitat, scenic, and open space conservation values (herein, the "conservation values");
- The property contributes to the protection of the scenic and natural character of Haverhill, and the protection of the Premises will enhance the open-space value of nearby conservation lands. The Premises is adjacent to approximately 43 acres of Haverhill Water Supply land, and will further the protection afforded by this and an additional nearby 53 acres of Water Supply Land also on Chadwick Pond. Across Kingsbury Avenue from the Premises, the Grantor holds a conservation restriction on 60 acres of farm and woodlands which, in turn, abuts a 210-acre Agricultural Preservation Restriction. The protection of the Premises increases the ecological viability of these conservation lands by creating robust landscape connectivity; and
- The property is part of a highly scenic landscape visible to members of the general public from Kingsbury Avenue, a public way; and
- Approximately 4 acres of the property are located within the 100-year floodplain, as
 identified by the United States Federal Emergency Management Agency, and the
 protection of this floodplain will ensure the continued availability of this flood storage
 during major storm events; and
- The property contains shoreline on Chadwick Pond, and abuts 3 acres designated Public Water Supply Watershed for Chadwick Pond by the City of Haverhill. Chadwick Pond is a reserve drinking water supply for the City. The conservation restriction adds to the adjacent City-owned water supply lands, thus increasing the protection of this water supply; and
- The property contain approximately 12 acres designated as Priority Habitat and Estimated Habitat for State-Protected Rare Species by the Massachusetts Natural Heritage and Endangered Species Program (NHESP); and
- Based on the data provided by the UMass Conservation Assessment and Prioritization System, 4 acres of the Premises fall into the top 50% of lands with the highest ecological integrity for aquatic ecosystems. This ecological integrity is mainly attributed to the middle portion of the property where several acres of wetlands can be found. The Premises contains 6 acres designated BioMap2 Aquatic Core Habitat and 4 acres designated Upland Buffer to the Aquatic Core Habitat by NHESP. One acre is

additionally designated BioMap2 for Species of Conservation Concern. These lands are critical for the long-term persistence of rare species as well as the diversity of natural communities and intact ecosystems across the Commonwealth; and

- The property will be managed as a public reservation by the Grantee for passive and low impact recreation, education and nature study, including providing public trail and non-motorized, car-top boat access to Chadwick Pond; and
- The property is mapped by the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service as having approximately 1.5 acres of soils designated Prime Farmland Soils, including much of the open field on the southern portion of the Premises that has been historically farmed for hay; and
- Protection of the property furthers the City of Haverhill's 2008 Open Space and Recreation Plan, specifically Goal 7: Enhance and increase open space and recreation opportunities available to the public.







Haverhill's Brightside Summary Report 2017/18

- < 81 adopt-a-park sites
- < Adopt-a-Parks have had new signs installed at a cost of \$65 per sign and \$10 for post

Adopt-a-Parks completed this year:

< Riverfront Park is now complete with new gardens throughout the park and boardwalk area. New sand has been added to the Bocci court for better playing conditions. Volunteer Bruce Donohue mows the lawn. Volunteer Bill Rogers waters the gardens throughout the summer. This could not be done without the help of the Tap Restaurant donating their hose and water until the irrigation system is connected to the Tap.</p>

The long extended boardwalk in the parking lot was redone with decorative grasses and bark mulch for easy maintenance.

- < Brightside on Earth Day cleaned up the historic site on Mill Street and had the sign restored by muralist Jeff Merrill.
- < Brightside worked with Carl Beltzer of Beltzer Realty in creating this beautiful park, with the anchor from the Nantucket Lightship as it's center piece. Mr. Beltzer has maintained this site for a number of years now by providing his own landscaper to mow the site. He appreciated all Brightside's help with this project.</p>
- < First Landing Park on Water Street is coming to completion. In May Brightside Board and volunteers filled 35 yard bags, removed the old broken arbor and cleaned out the garden areas.</p>

Under the guidance of Christine Hardiman graphic designer with Primary Design and Vice President of Haverhill's Brightside designed a new arbor for the park. It was built and installed by the Brightside Board. Dave Labrode chairperson for Brightside's City Wide Clean-up Program with his wife Cat volunteer to make park benches when needed and this year 9 benches were needed for different locations in the city, three going into First Landing Park. Flowers were planted around the stone monument that is dedicated to the Duston Family who are buried across the street in the Pentucket Burial Ground. Groveland Fence on Monday September 18th is installing a new post & chain fence along the front entrance.

Adopt-a-Planter Program:

< This program has been very successful with 32 planters being adopted. Brightside purchased 7 planters this year at a cost of \$625 per planter. These planters where placed on islands outside the core of the city and in Lafayette Square, Bradford Square and Currier Square areas. Brightside provides the soil, summer flowers and signage for the planters. The sponsors are responsible for the maintenance of the planter which consists of the watering & feeding of the plants, deadheading and</p>

trimming of the sweet potato vine, the removal of the summer flowers in the fall and the adding of the greens and berries for the winter months at a cost of \$170 for the year.

Bradford Burial Ground:

< The Tenney Family is to be commended for their dedication in maintaining and preserving this historic site. This burial ground is now on the National Register of Historic Places thanks to Barron Tenney and the Tenney Family Association. The Tenney Family Association has also donated \$5000 for the removal of a large pine tree at the burial ground that was in danger of falling onto the stones and creating more damage. They are on September 29, 2017 holding a New England Bean Supper at the home of Mr. & Mrs. Barron Tenney as a kick off to a fundraiser to help restore the stones at the burial ground.</p>

Bloomfest"

< On Saturday, September 16, 2017 Brightside planted peach rose bushes and blueberry pie ground cover sedum around the circle at the Haverhill Police Station. Spring of 2019 Brightside will place two small planters on either side of the entrance to the police station.
