



We are writing to enclose an Application for Permit for Amusements, Public, Shows, and Exhibitions. Our application is for the "Haverhill Better Block", a one-time event on May 6. We at Team Better Block are working under contract with MassDevelopment as technical assistance to the City as part of its work with MassDevelopment's Transformative Development Initiative (TDI) program. As you know, the Merrimack Street area in downtown Haverhill is one of ten TDI Districts statewide.

Team Better Block is based in Dallas. We originated in 2010 as an alternative to the traditional urban planning process. We utilize experimental architecture, tactical urbanism, and rapid prototyping to implement change at the neighborhood level. We have completed 50 Better Blocks nationwide, and over 200 have occurred using our open source toolkits. In Haverhill, our focus is on Merrimack Street in the heart of the TDI District. Building on planning work that has already been done by MassDevelopment and Utile, our goal is to present a new creative way to engage the public in order to prototype short-term interventions and longer-term opportunities. At the Haverhill Better Block, we're planning to test, temporarily over the course of a day, a number of urban elements, including enhanced pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure, trees and plantings, pop-up shops highlighting local entrepreneurs, storefront makeovers, a street wall of shops on Merrimack Street at the Goecke Deck and an outdoor beer garden.

We are also partnering with the O+ Festival to bring art, music, and wellness to the City. While most of the O+ Festival is on private property elsewhere in the City, we will be helping them construct a temporary music venue on Merrimack Street for the day of May 6. We will have live music and art at the the Better Block event, hosted by O+.

Since MassDevelopment is providing this event to the City as part of its TDI work, and the City is one of the main partners responsible for guiding this work, we are requesting that this be considered a "city-sponsored event" and that all fees be waived.

Further, we are requesting that, pursuant to Section 191-12(B) of City of Haverhill Code, fees for individual vendors within the event shall also be waived, as shall a sidewalk obstruction bond.

Finally, Noah Koretz from MassDevelopment discussed insurance with Orlando Pacheco at the City as well as Jim Travers, the City's insurance agent. Jim has confirmed that as a city-sponsored event, Better Block events on City property are covered under the City's insurance policy. Specific events that require additional insurance, such as the one day beer and wine license, will provide insurance paperwork naming the City of Haverhill. Noah will function as our local contact, so for any questions, please call him at (617) 413-5340. We look forward to bringing this great event to the City of Haverhill.

Amending Salary Ordinance - City Council/School Committee

As we discussed, a recent issue has arisen with regards to City Councillor's expense monies. I have discussed the matter with Mr. Benevento, Director of Finance, who also consulted with the City's outside auditors. He has confirmed that to be consistent with current IRS regulations the expenses monies qualify as a "nonaccountable plan" and should be paid as wages reported on a W-2 to each Councillor, rather than being reported on a 1099 as is currently done.

The IRS Publication "Taxable Fringe Benefits Guide" was created by the Internal Revenue Service office of Federal, State and Local Governments (FSLG) to provide governmental entities with a basic reference guide to Federal tax rules relating to employee fringe benefits and reporting. The Guide provides: "A nonaccountable plan is an allowance or reimbursement program or policy that does not meet all three requirements for an accountable plan. Payments, including advances, reimbursements, allowances, etc., made under a nonaccountable plan are taxable wages subject to all withholding when paid or when constructively received by an employee. The employees may be able to deduct these expenses as itemized deductions on their individual tax returns. $Reg. \ \S 1.62-2(c)(3)$ ".

Accordingly, I have submitted to you an updated ordinance which incorporates bith the wages and expenses as required. In updating the Ordinance, it was noted that the School Committee salaries should also be included in the Ordinance, as state law provides for Council approval of the salaries. Previously this was done through the budget process. It should be noted that the Ordinance does not provide for an increase in compensation for members of the City Council or School Committee.

MINUTES OF THE CITIZEN OUTREACH COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON APRIL 5, 2017

A Citizen Outreach Committee Meeting was held on Wednesday, April 5, 2017 at 7:00PM at Rehoboth Lighthouse Full Gospel Church, 409 Washington Street, Haverhill.

Agenda: Collaboration with Citizens regarding upcoming FY'18 budget hearings and associated neighborhood concerns.

- 1. Keith Boucher spoke of the need for the removal of snow on sidewalks. He asked that sidewalks (at least one side) on the densely populated busy main streets to be clear before children are sent to school. He presented a map that highlighted Washington Street, Grove Street and High Street. These roads are very busy feeder roads to Tilton, Consentino Silver Hill and Bartlett schools. The city should make a priority of clearing those sidewalks to keep children from walking in street. He also urged that the city get the word out to citizens of the requirement to clear sidewalks. Apply the resources (media, robo calls, social media and schools)necessary to inform citizens of the need to clear sidewalks. He also praised the idea of making bus stops safer by identifying them clearly.
- 2. George Moriarty, representing Northern Essex Community College, .spoke of NECCO's commitment to bringing the opportunity of both non-credit and credit classes to the citizens of the Mount Washington neighborhood. They are working with the working cities grant to bring access to job training and educational opportunities to those who could take advantage of improving skills. He also said the satellite office of Valley Works, which moved up to NECCO, is moving to a location in the downtown area. The hope was it would be available and centrally located to those who need their services.
- 3. Hartell Johnson Sidewalks need repair throughout city not just near schools. Job Resource Center needs to be near downtown.

- 4. Angie Esteves Health Fair at Silver Hill School April 29th will do blood pressure screenings, eye exams and dental checks. Working with the Chamber of Commerce. A Multi Cultural Committee will be forming with a meeting to be held April 12th. There are plans for many events this summer under the Working Cities umbrella.
- 5. John Cuneo on behalf of the Working Cities grant. They have plans for many events in the summer. Working to quantify there data of changes as the sustainability of the project will depend on their ability to show their progress. The Federal Reserve is both supportive and demanding task master. They are 6 months into grant and have spent little so far this summer will roll out more events/programs.
- 6. Janet Begin discussed the opportunity of establishing a wild flower Montessori preschool in the Mt. Washington area. There is a grant that will help her set up and outfit school but she will need another source of revenue to take on scholarship students. She envisions a class made up of half tuition half scholarship students. She hopes the city could assist in this as it has been noted that this early intervention before age 6 can have a tremendously positive impact ona child's success in life and as a student.
- 7. Josh Bower He is again going to have a Community Garden at his property. They now have fencing up around gardens to keep critters out. Many folks have plotsand it has been very successful. He looks forward to another successful season.
- 8. Kat Everette Spoke of the needs of the community and the work done by members of the Rehoboth Church. The members of the church feed 80 to 120 children each week. The church runs a teen drop in center. They are also continuing to work to bring men to be involved fathers for their children. Pose has applied for a grant from the department of labor to add in their continued work.
- 9. Angie Esteves spoke of the need to address the opioid crisis on the neighborhood level. Reach out to the community through the bodegas and barbershops to spread word. More has to be done.

10. Allana LeBlanco - spoke of the how positive and full of love the evening had been.
