# Investment Consultant Review & Update

- Overview of Markets and Performance Report.

- 1. The Board had no manager updates.

- 2. Gus gave the Board an update on the financial markets through January 2/2018. Equities, as measured by the S&P 500 index, have performed well over the last year and are up 22.85% while fixed income was up 3.24% (as measured by the Barclays Aggregate Bond index). Gus provided an update on tax reform and the potential positive impact on U.S. GDP and equities. On a cautionary note, Gus discussed the high valuations in the equity markets and the potentially contractionary effect of monetary policy as the US Central Bank is in the process of shrinking its balance sheet and increasing the fed funds rate.
- 3. Gus provided an update on the portfolio and told the Board that through November 30, 2017, the total portfolio was up 13.60% gross of fees and 13.42% net of fees. This compares to a return of 15.58% for the PRIT Fund for the same period. Gus noted the performance of several managers in his review that were performing well. Gus gave the Board updates on Fisher Investments Small Value, which has performed well relative to its index, and Putnam Investments Small Growth portfolio, which has performed positively relative to the Russell 2000 Growth index over three month periods ending December 31, 2107, though returns over the longer period, including since inception performance, have lagged the index. Gus also discussed recent communications with Wolf Popper and suggested that David communicate with Tony Teberio at People's Bank to discuss if they are filling on recent settlements on behalf of the system
- 4. The Board reviewed the rebalancing report and made the following decision:
- Take out \$ 6M from cash (appropriation) and allocate the money to IR&M.
- 5. Gus presented the Board with a fee analysis for 2015 and 2016. Gus indicated that the data for 2014 was not available given that PERAC's first report on fees started in 2015. The Board requested to do a preliminary analysis of the fees for 2017. Gus indicated that Wainwright will work with People's Bank to have the information available in the months to come.

A motion as made by Poore to move \$6 million from People's United Bank to IR&M Fixed income, seconded by MacDonald.
