13.4. Order – to Establish the Opioid Recovery and Remediation Stabilization Fund *Related communication from Chris Sicuranza, Mayor's Chief of Staff*

Chris Sicuranza, Chief of Staff, addressed the Council regarding the Opioid Recovery and Remediation Fund which the city will receive just under \$320K by 2031. Included memo with a list of ways the funds can be used, such as having

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communities pool resources, will follow up with more details later. Purpose tonight is to establish the stabilization fund.

Councillor Bevilacqua questioned item #4(d) safe injection sites, and states does not support that provision and will vote against for that reason.

Chief of Staff Sicuranza clarified that this is just to establish the particular fund; not specific earmark language that necessitates to do items listed in memo. Memo was done to help Council with process. Voting tonight to establish the stabilization fund not to implement programs as listed. The list provided is not mandates. It is just revised guidance from the state but to start you have to vote to establish a fund and if you don't you give the opioid money back. There are no programs to discuss right now.

President Jordan confirmed with Chief of Staff Sicuranza that the City Council does not get to unilaterally decide how this going to work, we are just one partner in the whole thing. The role tonight is to just approve a fund.

Chief of Staff Sicuranza confirmed stating it is to comply with the revised guidance and the city will be audited every year through special reporting.
