PRESIDENT SULLIVAN ASSIGNED THE MINUTES TO COUNCILOR TOOHEY

- 5. COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MAYOR:
 - 5.1. Mayor Barrett requests to inform the Council that the Executive Office of Housing and Livable Communities has issued a determination that the City of Haverhill is in compliance with the MBTA Communities Act under Section 3A of the Zoning Act

MAYOR BARRETT ADDRESSED THE COUNCIL. SHE STATED THAT THE COUNCIL APPROVED THE PLAN TWO YEARS AGO SUBMITTED BY THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR WILLIAM PILLSBURY TO PUT US IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE MBTA COMMUNITY ACT. SHE INFORMED THE COUNCIL THAT LAST WEEK THE CITY GOT WORD WE WERE APPROVED. WE ARE NOT BUILDING 10,000 UNITS. SHE STATED THIS IS JUST A ZONING BILL. WE ARE COMPLIANT AND THAT ALLOWS US TO GET GRANTS FROM THE STATE. MOST OF THE AREA THAT IS THIS ZONE IS ALREADY BUILT. THIS IS THE DOWNTOWN AS YOU THINK OF IT TODAY. THIS IS A ZONING BILL NOT A MANDATE TO BUILD. OUT OF THE 130 COMMUNITIES THE CITY IS ONE OF ONLY 32 THAT HAVE COMPLIED. SHE NOTED THAT IN THE COMMUNICATION THERE WAS A NEW AVAILABLE GRANT OPPORTUNITY.

WILLIAM PILLSBURY, PLANNING AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR ADDRESSED THE COUNCIL. HE STATED THE MAYOR JUST MENTIONED THE INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT IS UNIQUE TO COMMUNITIES THAT ARE COMPLIANT. HE STATED THEY NEED TO BE IN THE DISTRICT OR IN THE VICINITY OF THE DISTRICT. THE GRANT AMOUNTS RANGE FROM \$250,000-\$1,000,000.

COUNCILOR BASILIERE ASKED WHAT TYPE OF INFRASTRUCTURE?

WILLIAM PILLSBURY STATED WATER, SEWER, CSO ISSUES, SIDEWALKS, STREETS, TELECOMMUNICATIONS, INTERNET CONNECTIONS AND THE LITTLE WALKWAY ALONG LITTLE RIVER. HE NOTED THAT WE HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO LINK THIS ESSEX STREET CORRIDOR TO LAFAYETTE SQUARE AND MAYBE REDO LAFAYETTE SQUARE AGAIN. HE STATED OUR DISTRICT IS 118 ACRES WHICH INCLUDES THE 40R DISTRICT, MERRIMACK ST. ON BOTH SIDES. THEY SAID PRESUME THAT THERE ARE NO BUILDINGS AND CAN YOU ACCOMPLISH THE DENSITY REQUIRED BY THE LAW AND THE ANSWER IS YES. HE NOTED THERE IS NO MANDATE TO BUILD ANYTHING AND THERE IS NO MANDATE TO BUILD ANYTHING AFFORDABLE IN THIS AREA. HE STATED THIS COUNCIL IN EARLIER ITERATIONS WENT FORWARD AND PASSED THE 40R DISTRICT.
