President Barrett read the following statement: This meeting of the Haverhill City Council is being conducted remotely consistent with Governor Baker's Executive Order of March 12, 2020, due to the current State of Emergency in the Commonwealth due to the outbreak of the "COVID-19 Virus".

In order to mitigate the transmission of the COVID-19 Virus, we have been advised and directed by the Commonwealth to suspend public gatherings, and as such, the Governor's Order suspends the requirement of the Open Meeting Law to have all meetings in a publicly accessible *physical* location. Further, all members of public bodies are allowed and encouraged to participate remotely.

The Order, which you can find posted with agenda materials for this meeting allows public bodies to meet entirely remotely and live so long as reasonable public access is afforded so that the public can follow along with the deliberations of the meeting. This meeting will feature public comment.

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 Pandemic, Governor Baker issued an Emergency Order temporarily suspending certain provisions of the Open Meeting Law, M.G.L. c. 30A sec. 20. Public bodies otherwise governed by the OML are temporarily relieved from the requirement that meetings be held in public places, open and physically accessible to the public, so long as measures are taken to ensure public access to the bodies' deliberations "through adequate, alternative means."

Mayor Fiorentini requests to give an update on Haverhill's efforts regarding the Coronavirus (COVID-19) crisis along with Councillor Daly O'Brien.

Mayor Fiorentini shared that there will be 2 free testing sites coming to Haverhill. One is the "Stop the Spread" testing site at Locke and Essex Streets, in front of Butch's restaurant, same location as before, this Saturday at 9am. Another site at Consentino School run by the Veterans Administration. It is available to veterans regardless of discharge status and spouses or widows. This past Monday, those 55 plus or having one co-morbidity are eligible to receive the vaccine. Starting April 19th everyone 16 and over will be eligible for the vaccine. Use the state website to enroll.

Councillor Daly O'Brien added that surfaces no longer need to be disinfected as they are considered low risk. Use of soap or detergent is adequate. Continue to follow protocol for masking, distancing and washing hands. PLACED ON FILE 5K
