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#### 10. HEARINGS AND RELATED ORDERS:

10.1. CCSP 25-1, Document 32; Attorney Magliochetti representing Astro Enterprise LLC, requests to build a 4-unit condo building at 0 Nichols st in the RU Zone – (residential urban density) Map 608, Block 485, Lots 6-7 Continued from June 3, 2025

Recommendation from Planning Director to conduct the previously opened hearing and based on the fact that the application is now complete take action on the permit making the required findings and specifying any conditions to be added to the special permit

#### President Sullivan re-opened the special permit hearing.

Attorney Paul Magliocchetti addressed the City Council on behalf of Astro Enterprise LLC, requesting a special permit to build a four-unit condominium structure at 9-11 Nichols Street. He noted the applicant had previously received a variance from the Board of Appeals to subdivide the lot and praised the developer, Juan Valerio, for agreeing to construct owner-occupied condos rather than rental units. He emphasized that the proposal aligns with zoning ordinance 255-10.4.2 and will not negatively impact the neighborhood's character, which is already densely populated with multifamily homes. He highlighted that all city departments raised no objections except for trash placement, which has since been resolved. The project meets parking and access requirements, improves housing availability, and will increase the city's tax base. He submitted supporting documents and requested Council approval of the special permit.

Mr. Juan Valerio, Main Street, Boxford, MA he noted he was a loan officer, he spoke to the council about the difficulties his clients face in qualifying for housing despite having jobs and income. Due to high interest rates, many are unable to secure loans. He proposed building four condominiums to help families achieve homeownership.

President Sullivan asked if anyone would like to speak in favor? No one spoke. President Sullivan asked if anyone would like to speak in opposition? No one spoke. President Sullivan closed the hearing.

Motion by Councilor McGonagle for passage with discussion and all conditions, Second Vice President Jordan.

Vice President Jordan inquired about the construction timeline and pricing, expressing support for the project's focus on homeownership through condominiums. Councilor Lewandowski emphasized the importance of clear snow removal plans and ensuring the condo designation is finalized before occupancy. Councilor Ferreira supported the project's alignment with the masterplan and proposed including a landscape plan at development review.

Motion by Councilor Ferreira to include a landscape plan at development review, Second Vice President Jordan.

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Councilor Hobbs Everett commended the upkeep and neighborhood value of the property. Councilor McGonagle supported the reduced unit count and improved parking, while Councilor Michitson highlighted the project's low impact on city services and invited the developer to an upcoming housing plan meeting. Councilor Rogers had questions about shared driveways, snow removal, and the implications of reducing parking availability in a congested area. Councilor Basiliere shared positive feedback from local police and residents, noting the impact of increased homeownership on neighborhood safety. Councilor Toohey requested that parking spaces be formally assigned in the condo documents

Councilor Toohey stated I would like to make that a condition. Councilor Rogers stated I will second that.

He also inquired about the suitability of the site for families with children. President Sullivan supported the project for its promotion of homeownership, manageable impact on parking, and proximity to public parks.

City Clerk Wright stated I have a motion from Councilor Lewandowski for a snow removal plan, Second, Councilor Michitson.
