SUBJECT: Resolution authorizing the Mayor to file Documents related to the State Economic Development Incentive Program (EDIP Program)

I am pleased to file the attached resolution relative to new building construction, capital equipment investment and job creation project for Bay State Pallet Company at 293 Neck Road in the Ward Hill Business Park.

Bay State proposes to construct a 22,000 sq. ft addition with loading docks and to rehabilitate an existing 15,000 sq ft building. As a result, the City will see the first redevelopment of a Ward Hill Business Park property since the new densification zoning passed.

This project represents the expansion of another essential business within the City. Bay State already operates out of 125 Ward Hill Avenue and this project will allow them to expand into the recycled and reclaimed lumber market. Bay State moved to Haverhill in 2012 from Peabody and some of their current employees relocated their families to Haverhill around that time. This is yet another example of a small family owned business investing in Haverhill despite the pandemic.

Bay State is seeking the assistance of the state and the city to make this investment possible, and this resolution and the TIF agreement represents the City's participation in a partnership with the States Office of Business Development in the EDIP program. As you know the City has utilized this program on several occasions in the past to help create new jobs by providing a Tax Increment Financing (TIF) agreement related to the improvements to the real estate thus

enabling the company to proceed to receive tax credits and other assistance from the EDIP Program.

To facilitate this effort, we are asking the City Council to approve the attached resolution authorizing the Mayor to enter into a Tax Increment Financing (TIF) agreement for the property referenced above and to file the proper paperwork with the State for the TIF and all other required EDIP documents and certifications for the property and the project.

I will be happy to answer any questions that you may have and respectfully ask for passage of the proposed resolution to enable this exciting project to go forward.

MINUTES OF THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON JANUARY 18, 2022

There was a meeting of the Planning and Development Committee on Tuesday, January 18, 2022 at 6:00 PM in the Council Chambers. The meeting was hybrid with zoom connection and was also broadcast live by HC Media.

Committee Members present were Chairman Joseph Bevilacqua, Councillor Michael McGonagle, and Councillor Catherine Rogers.

Also present were Councillor Melinda Barrett, William Pillsbury - Planning and Economic Director, Richard MacDonald - Inspectional Services Director, Tom Bridgewater - Building Inspector, Solicitor Cox, Angelo Petrozelli of Design Architects, and Matthew Juros of Fishbrook Design.

Attending remotely were Mayor Fiorentini and Council President Timothy Jordan.

The Chairman called the meeting to order and read the open meeting language and the language relative to taping of the meeting. He noted the first item on the agenda tonight was Possible design review procedure, criteria, and requirements for special permit applications. The Chairman asked Councilor Barrett to introduce the item as she had placed it on the Council agenda (Doc. 5-B).

Councilor Barrett discussed this grew out of the discussion regarding the funeral home application on Kenoza and wanted her suggestion to be an aid not a hindrance to people but to have someone on the city side with the capabilities to review the architectural and landscaping proposed for better results of the project.

Mayor Fiorentini discussed he had mixed feelings on design review and had spoken to several people who were of the opinion design review boards killed development and do not assist and further advised that he believes design review discussion can play a role at the beginning of the process, and not at the end of process. The Mayor noted there should be standards up front in beginning of process.

Councillor McGonagle noted he was not in opposition to anything the Mayor said and that he concurred the discussion should be up front in process well before Council meeting.

Planning and Economic Development Director Pillsbury advised there is room for review in the early phase of the project. He noted the question to be asked is what the standards are to be reviewed. He noted there are now standards for Merrimack Street and the waterfront district, and the Historic District are in place. He emphasized that review should take place early in the process based on some standards. Inspectional Services Director MacDonald believed from his experience that design review boards hold up projects. He advised that standards are what are important and the way we should go.

Solicitor Cox asked what is the question you want reviewed? He noted under section 10.4.2 review criteria of special permits do not give permit granting authority as to criteria on style, appearance, etc. but neighborhood character is ok.

Councilor Barrett stated she was not looking for design review board but having someone with the skill sets at beginning of project.

Solicitor Cox asked whose concern is it, the Council or Neighborhoods?

Councilor Rogers stated she believed standards are what we should have not design review board. Chairman Bevilacqua suggested that a neighborhood meeting in the beginning of the process is what should be added to the special permit process.

Director Pillsbury stated that he always recommends that.

Council President Jordan stated that we should get someone involved in the process earlier.

Angelo Petrozelli, Design Architects discussed the various standards that are in place for the Washington Street Historic District a set of rules to be followed that has to be done up front. He noted we don't have that now on every project. He also discussed how other communities utilize an upfront process.

Matt Juros, Fishbrook design, discussed an architect has to balance aesthetics, culture, etc. with structural design. He further noted the question should be to inspire quality and set up standards that are known early in the process.

Mayor commented he believed there was something in downtown overlay that enables the City to hire an architect for peer review.

After further discussion motion was made which incorporated the discussion by Committee member Councilor McGonagle to send a letter to Director Pillsbury to ask his ideas to have an early process review; include a neighborhood meeting before the hearing at the beginning of the process; and asking Director Pillsbury to develop recommendations and bring those back to this Committee, and that the letter also be sent to the Mayor, city departments and architects here tonight. Committee member Councillor Rogers seconded the motion. The Chairman called for a vote and the motion was voted in favor by Bevilacqua, McGonagle and Rogers.

The Chairman moved to the next item on the Committee's agenda Possible procedure and criteria for evaluating proposed changes to approved special permits and called upon Councillor Barrett to introduce this item as she had placed this on the Council agenda. Councillor Barrett discussed if there could be agreement on possible

minor special permit changes that the departments can review and approve without having to come back to the Council or other special permit authority (Doc. 5-C).

Director MacDonald was asked for an example, and he gave one where a special permit was approved with a pitched roof but then the applicant wanted to have a flat roof which was a project change.

Director Pillsbury recommended allowing Solicitor Cox and Director MacDonald and his office to review what is in place now and come back to the Committee with recommendations.

Councillor Barrett discussed that one project years ago came before the Council with a brick facade but when it was built it was wood. Chairman Bevilacqua noted in his opinion that should be a major amendment to the special permit and have to come back before the Council for approval as the City has a right to expect what was proposed is what should be built.

Angelo Petrozelli and Matt Juros each commented and noted the certain conditions represented by a developer is what you vote on.

The Committee asked to include in the review if minor changes would have to come back for a public hearing or just a meeting before the Council.

A motion was made by Committee member Councillor McGonagle to send a letter to Director Pillsbury and these Departments present to review these questions and bring back recommendations to the Committee, and that the letter would also be sent to the architects present.

Solicitor Cox noted you could look at projects and the rules of the district the project falls in and look at what the special permit provided for with conditions. Councillor McGonagle asked if ordinances should be applicable to all districts?

The Committee further asked the Solicitor review if major design changes should come back to the special permit granting authority, or can the City Departments approve a change without coming back to granting authority?

As discussion was concluded, a vote was called by the Chairman and Committee members Councillors McGonagle and Rogers and Committee Chairman Bevilacqua all voted in favor of the motion.

As there was no other business before the Committee, a motion was made by Committee member Councillor McGonagle to adjourn, seconded by Committee member Councillor Rogers, and voted in favor by all. The meeting was adjourned at 7:15pm.

Broco Oil, Inc. is currently undertaking a significant 18-month improvement project at its biodiesel and propane fuel terminal located at 168 Hale Street in Haverhill. As part of these improvements, entry and exit sliding security gates and perimeter fencing is proposed at the main Hale Street entrance and the principal truck access location on lower Eighth Avenue.

The City's review of Broco's fence permit application (# 89942) for this security work indicates that Broco's plans reflect work in the municipal roadway right-of-way at each work location. These identified impacts are extremely minor and are on property recognized as private ways in both instances.

At the main Hale Street location at the base of Burke Street, the concern is a proposed 35' section of 7' foot chain link fence that extends into the former layout of discontinued Hale Street – this wrap around perimeter fencing section is needed to prevent trespassers from simply walking around the security gate to gain access to our terminal property.

The gate and associated fencing plans at the lower Eighth Avenue truck entrance call for the 28' mechanical gate section to slide along Broco's lower garage building which closely abuts the 40' roadway layout, also designated as "private" and maintained for snow plowing by Broco. Upon activation, the gate section slides to the right into a two-foot-wide pocket along the southern side of the building. The gate travel way is protected by a 7' chain link fence two feet off the building. The measurement from the edge of pavement at the southern edge of the roadway is 42' to the side of Broco's lower garage building. The design allows room for the 2' sliding security gate pocket while respecting the City's original 40' roadway layout at this section of lower Eighth Avenue.

Broco has been advised to request an "obstruction in the right of way" variance by the City Council as a condition of further consideration of its pending fence permit. Broco therefore respectfully requests that this petition request is placed on the City Council agenda for further discussion and consideration of the public security and neighborhood traffic benefits that will result from these terminal safety improvements. To provide additional context for the City Council we have attached municipal plot plans with the gate and fence layout plans overlaid, and photographs of existing conditions.
