

Haverhill Parking Ordinance Changes

Dear Mayor Fiorentini:

As requested, the following is a brief summary and justification of the proposed paid parking regulatory changes tabled at the December $\mathbf{1}^{\mathrm{st}}$ City Council meeting. As you know, these recommended regulatory changes, along with other complimentary parking program improvements, were presented to the Haverhill Central District Parking Commission who were in general agreement with them.

The proposed regulatory changes are consistent with the City's original Guiding Principles developed nearly 10 years ago with the implementation of the Paid Parking Program. They are intended to make the parking program more consistent, understandable, convenient, user-friendly, financially self-sustaining, reliable and more effective at balancing the use parking assets within a 5-minute walk of the riverfront. They are also consistent with recommendations from three (3) previous Parking Program Evaluations since 2012 conducted by two different parking consultant firms.

1. Establish consistent on- and off-street paid parking hours: Mondays through Saturdays from 10 am to 8 pm

Currently, the City charges for parking Mondays through Fridays in its parking lots from 8 am to 8 pm and on street from 3 pm to 8 pm. The City does not charge for parking on Saturdays as most other cities do.

Saturday is the City's peak parking day of the week - when pricing to better regulate and manage the use of its entire parking supply is most needed. With free Saturday parking, much of the paid parking system is at capacity making it difficult for customers and visitors to find available spaces. At the same time, the nearby parking garages and non-metered parking just a short walk away is significantly underutilized.

Similarly, on weekdays, on-street parking is free until 3 p.m. – right through the busy lunchtime hours when it can be extremely difficult to find an available on-street parking space – particularly on-street and in lots within the Washington Street Corridor. At these times, there is also plenty of available parking in the two parking garages and in non-metered parking areas just a short walk away.

Conversely, the City charges in its parking lots as early as 8 a.m., even though parking utilization data collected over the last eight (8) years has consistently shown that there is plenty of parking availability in the lots and on-street until just after 10 a.m. – making pricing unnecessary during this period.

Charging for parking on Saturdays and during the busy weekday lunchtime hours will increase parking availability and turnover on streets such as Washington, Wingate, Granite, Railroad and Essex, while reducing traffic congestion created by parkers "hunting" for available spaces. Use of the underutilized Goecke Deck, MVRTA garage and free parking areas will also increase. Consistent hours of operation on-street and in the lots will also eliminate customer confusion on when to pay.

2. Increase permit parking in paid municipal lots

For a downtown employee working and parking 40 hours/week, the current \$20/month parking lot permit fee equates to just 12.5 cents/hour for use of the prime downtown lots – many of which are approaching or at capacity. This was a hefty 75% discount off the hourly rate of 50 cents/hour. When hourly rates within off-street lots are increased, there is typically a proportional increase in the monthly permit fee to maintain the City-established discounted permit rate.

However, since parking permit rates were increased a couple of years ago from \$15 to \$20/month, but not the hourly rate, the recommended increase to the monthly permit rate, given the doubling of the hourly rate from \$0.50/hour to \$1.00/hour, is \$30.00 (twice the previous \$15 monthly rate). The \$30.00 monthly rate is the same rate recommended by the consulting firm Nelson-Nygaard following a parking program evaluation in 2012 to address the large number of permits sold in the first year of paid parking and the resulting shortage of permit parking spaces, particularly in the Washington Street corridor lots. This condition remains today.

The recommended \$30.00 monthly permit rate was reduced to \$25.00 at the recent Haverhill Parking Commission meeting.

As requested, I will be attending the December 8th City Council meeting to present the data analysis supporting these recommendations and answering any questions that may arise.




