#### President Sullivan opened the hearing.

Glenn Belanger, 145 Elliot Street, lived on Elliot Street for the last 46 years. In 2021, I approached the city to add an addition to my home so my daughter and husband could raise a family there. I was only allowed 750 sq. ft. On September 1, 2024, I applied for another permit to enlarge the space which was too small. During the permit process, I was held up by the Conservation Commission. The zoning was changed where the water off of my roof into my driveway went beyond the square footage of my property. Mr. Moore came to the conclusion that I would need a civil engineer to draw up plans for a dry well and tank for two gutters for this 12x14 addition. I had to hire a civil engineer for plans, hired a contractor to dig up the yard for the dry well system at an additional cost of \$4000. I am here tonight to allow me to put this bedroom on for my granddaughter.

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President Sullivan asked if anyone would like to speak in favor? No one spoke. President Sullivan asked if anyone would like to speak in opposition? No one spoke. President Sullivan closed the hearing.

Councilor McGonagle: Thank you for your presentation, it makes perfect sense. I know from experience from both sides that Rob Moore is very thorough and very good at what he does. He keeps us safe and does the right thing. I will support this. I know the zoning changed but looks like there is no objection from Conservation or Engineering.

President Sullivan: I do intend to support this as well. I know you have been through a lot. Rob Moore really does protect the city's interests and does an excellent job. This is a no brainer. Councilor Jordan asked what the city solicitor learned regarding delivery.

President Sullivan stated the city opted into delivery at the time the city approved the cannabis statue. No affirmative action, it was part of the package with wasn't prominently stated in the materials at the time. Councilor Jordan asked for clarification if delivery is from outside the city, not from shops within the city.

Mathhew Provencher, Attorney with MTC, stated as drafted functionally the way the ordinance currently reads for zoning purposes you allow a catch all provision for other licensed marijuana establishments

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which would include delivery operations however based on the review of the host community agreements is that none of the host community agreements that you have currently permit first party delivery operations within the City of Haverhill. The zoning could potentially allow, should the city agree to it. Mayor Barrett stated to become a delivery service, they have to renegotiate their HCA.

President Sullivan stated the City Solicitor item will be placed on the next agenda at that time will be placed on file for 10 days and back middle of May for vote.

Councilor Lewandowski stated an error on number 6 of the Cannabis Policy should be a "d" on "entitle".
