Attorney Cox gave an update on the settlement from several suits the city engaged in. Haverhill receiving \$1.712 million over 18 years. First payment this spring of \$192,539 (goes to separate fund). Smaller settlement of \$75,700 receiving now. Money can only be used for opioid treatment.

Councillor comments include asking where funds will be held, asked if could be used for second police social worker position, shared service agreement details, department of public health assistance, what are specific guidelines.

Colin LePage addressed the Council giving statistics on opioid prescriptions, Haverhill overdoses of 622 in last twelve months. Priority should go to the people.
