
President Jordan opened the hearing.



15. COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCILLORS:

Councillor Joseph Bevilacqua proposes a 2-hour notification requirement 15.1. for the City to notify residents of a sewerage discharge into the Merrimack River impacting Haverhill

Councillor Bevilacqua explained Council office received notice from a citizen asking why the City did not notify its residents when sewer was discharged into the Merrimack River. Offering options of notification including but not limited to just on website.

Motion to pass local ordinance that requires a 2-hour notification period and continuation of that notice when untreated raw sewage is dumped into the Merrimack river and that it be a responsibility of the City, as well as following whatever state regulations are required.

Motion by Councillor Bevilacqua, second Councillor Lewandowski



Councillor Barrett spoke with Robert Ward who indicated the city does have a lengthy email list of citizens who receives the CFO reporting, there is also a map on the city website. The city is complying with the state regulations. Agree could do a better job of sending it out to a broader audience but the information is there.

Councillor Sullivan stated in spite of what Councillor Barrett said, still supports what Councillor Bevilacqua is getting at. Maybe not a 2-hour requirement, but if that is the motion will support to get a better discussion going with the Mayor and the head of the Water Department to see if we can do the robocalls or something else. Need to be a little more proactive and on top of it. It is a growing concern. It is not going away and as we continue to address it; it is going to take years to complete the mission. We need to improve the communications systems.

Vice President Michitson also spoke with Mr. Ward stating the City is ready to go live with the notification which is apparently primarily through email. However, I do agree that we ought to be doing robocalls and also using social media.

Councillor Toohey agrees with colleagues. We need to do whatever we can to make sure the residents are notified as soon as possible. Supports the 2-hour window and read from the state perspective, that there is an update every 8 hours and would like to see this as well in the future.
