William Pillsbury gave a presentation of future zoning changes to the city due to the MBTA Community Legislation. Focus for tonight was to achieve interim compliance as required by the State for filing on May 2, 2022.

Councillor comments included if the state had the guidelines yet, can existing 40R be included in number and can Councillors write letters to have them included, legislators need to be contacted, questioned if development project will have to come before council, what is parking reduction, what is bandwidth.

Mr. Pillsbury stated that this is a zoning mandate, not a housing production mandate, that the final rules will not go into effect until the end of 2024. The state is requiring each city to bring the issue before their city councils now in order to continue to be eligible to apply for various state grants.
