The purpose of the corporation is to engage in the following business activities:

ARTICLE III

A corporation may have one or more classes of members. If it does, the designation of such classes, the manner of election or appointments, the duration of membership and the qualifications and rights, including voting rights, of the members of each class, may be set forth in the by-laws of the corporation or may be set forth below:

RE: Communication from the Mayor regarding FY2022 Budget

Dear Madame President and Members of the Haverhill City Council:

I wish to speak before the city Council Tuesday night concerning the FY 2022 Budget.

The budget this year, for the 18th year in a row, is balanced with no request for an override or a debt exclusion. While there are always needs, we also have to take into account the financial pain that our taxpayers are undergoing and their ability to pay. This budget balances meeting our needs with meeting the needs of the constituents we represent.

The big change in the budget is the request to create a new Department of Public Health. That Department of Public Health would consist of public health nurses, a social worker and an administrative assistant. If the Council approves the creation of this Department of Public Health I will ask our Citizens Center Public Health Nurse, Mary Connolly, to be the first ever Director of the Haverhill Department of Public Health.

This pandemic has shown us that we need to do more to improve the public health of our citizens. We need to provide more education. We need to do more outreach. We need to have more clinics in the neighborhoods. We need to do more testing and we need to do more vaccinations of every type.

We certainly cannot do everything in one year, nor should we try, nor can we do everything on our own. I envision a Department of Public Health that works closely with our medical providers, the hospital, PMA and particularly the Greater Lawrence Family Health Center in order to provide these services.

I would like to be before the Council to speak about this on Tuesday night.
