GUIDELINES FOR THE DISPLAY OF FLAGS ON CITY HALL PROPERTY

The purpose of this Order is to establish guidelines for the display by the City of Haverhill of (1) flags of governments recognized by the Federal Government; and (2) other flags on or at City Hall. Nothing herein shall be construed to conflict with City of Haverhill Code, Ordinances, Chapter 39.

It is the policy of the City of Haverhill that flags should be displayed in conformance with Federal and State policies, as stated in the Federal "Our Flag" publication of the Congress, House Document No. 96-144; Chapter 2, Section 6 of the Massachusetts General Laws and Chapter 2, Section 6A of the Massachusetts General Laws.

Outdoor flags will be flown at City facilities in the following order of precedence: first, the United States flag; second, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts flag; and third, the City of Haverhill flag.

The City's flagpoles are not intended to serve as a forum for free expression by the public. The following flags may be displayed by the City as an expression of the City's official sentiments:

- a. Flags of Governments Recognized by the United States. Flags of governments recognized by the United States may be displayed upon the proclamation of the Mayor or by resolution of the City Council.
- b. Flags Displayed in Conjunction With Official Events or Ceremonies as Announced by Mayoral Proclamation or City Council Resolution. By proclamation of the Mayor or resolution of the City Council, other flags may be displayed at official City events or ceremonies.
- c. Ownership of Other Flags. The City shall acquire ownership of all flags that it flies on or at City Hall.

The unwritten policy of the City with regards to the display of flags on City Hall property has always been that the Mayor approves the flying of flags other than the United States flag, the Commonwealth flag and the City flag. Mayors have only approved the flying of other flags as an expression of the City's official sentiments in coordination with Mayoral proclamations and/or Council resolutions. The City's flag poles have never served as a forum for free expression by the public.

A recent Supreme Court case involving the City of Boston, Shurtleff v. City of Boston, found that the City's rejection of a request from a religious group to fly a religious flag on City Hall Plaza was inconsistent with the protections of the First Amendment. At issue was the City's undisputed practice to essentially allow any and all requests to hold flag-raising ceremonies utilizing one of the flagpoles on City Hall Plaza, subject only to scheduling and logistic considerations. The Shurtleff court held that the City of Boston's rejection of a religious flag violated the First Amendment, in the same way that rejecting an applicant's request to use a publicly-available community or conference room, based upon religion (or other protected expression), would violate the First Amendment.

This has never been the policy of the City of Haverhill. To provide clear guidance to anyone making such an inquiry, it is my recommendation that the City adopt the proposed Order - Guidelines for the Display of Flags on City Hall Property.

ORDERED:

AN ACT ESTABLISHING GUIDELINES FOR THE INSTALLATION AND USE OF ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATIONS IN THE CITY OF HAVERHILL.

Be it enacted, etc. as follows:

SECTION 1. For the purposes of this act the following terms shall, unless the context clearly requires otherwise, have the following meanings:-

"Association", any association of homeowners, community association, condominium association, cooperative or any other nongovernmental entity with covenants, bylaws and administrative provisions with which a homeowner's compliance is required.

"Dedicated parking spot", refers to both parking spots that are located within an owner's separate interest, as well as the parking spots that are in a common area, but subject to exclusive use rights of an owner, including, but not limited to, a deeded parking space, a garage space, a carport or a parking space that is specifically designated for use by a particular owner.

"Electric vehicle charging system", a system that is designed in compliance with Article 625 of the National Electrical Code and delivers electricity from a source outside an electric vehicle into 1 or more electric vehicles. An electric vehicle charging system may include several charge points simultaneously connecting several electric vehicles to the system.

"Owner", a person or persons who own a separate lot, unit or interest, along with an undivided interest or membership interest in the common area of the entire project, including but not limited to condominiums, planned unit developments and parcels subject to a homeowner's association.

"Reasonable restrictions", restrictions that do not significantly increase the cost of the station, significantly decrease its efficiency or specified performance, or effectively prohibit the installation altogether.

"Separate interest", the separate lot, unit, or interest to which an owner has exclusive rights of ownership.

- SECTION 2. An association in the city of Haverhill may not prohibit or unreasonably restrict an owner from installing an electric vehicle charging station on or in areas subject to their separate interest, on or in areas to which they have exclusive use, or on a common element, so long as it was within a reasonable distance of the dedicated parking spot. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit an association from making reasonable restrictions as defined in section 1.
- SECTION 3. (a) Installation of any electric vehicle charging station in the city of Haverhill is subject to the following provisions:
- (i) The electric vehicle charging station must be installed at the owner's expense;
- (ii) The electric vehicle charging station must be installed by a licensed contractor and/or electrician; and
- (iii) An electric vehicle charging station in the city of Haverhill shall meet all applicable health, safety and accessibility standards and requirements imposed by national, state, and local authorities, as well as all other applicable zoning, land use or other ordinances or land use permits.
- (c) An association in the city of Haverhill may require an owner to submit an application before installing a charging station, subject to the following provisions:
- (i) If the association requires such an application, the application shall be processed and approved by the association in the same manner as an application for approval of an architectural modification to the property, and shall not be willfully avoided or delayed;
- (ii) The association shall approve the application if the owner complies with the association's architectural standards and the provisions of this act;
- (iii) The approval or denial of an application should be in writing;
- (iv) If an application is not denied in writing after 60 days from the date of receipt of the application, the application shall be deemed approved, unless that delay is the result of a reasonable request for additional information; and
- (v) The association may not assess or charge the owner any fees for the placement of any electric vehicle charging station, beyond reasonable fees for processing the application, provided that such fees exist for all applications for approval of architectural modifications.

SECTION 4. (a) In the city of Haverhill, the owner and each successive owner of the separate interest or with exclusive rights to the area where the electric vehicle charging system is installed in the city shall be responsible for:

- (i) Disclosing to prospective buyers the existence of any charging station of the owner and the related responsibilities of the owner under this section;
- (ii) If the electric vehicle charging station is removable and the owner intends to remove the station in order to install it at their new place of residence, they must also disclose this fact to prospective buyers;
- (iii) Costs for the maintenance, repair, replacement of the electric charging vehicle station until it has been removed, and for the restoration of the common area after removal;
- (iv) Costs for damage to the electric vehicle charging station, common area, exclusive common area, or separate interests resulting from the installation, maintenance, repair, removal, or replacement of the charging station;
- (v) The cost of electricity associated with the electric vehicle charging station; and
- (vi) Removing the electric vehicle charging station if reasonably necessary for the repair, maintenance, or replacement of any property of the association or of separate interests.
- (b) Pursuant to this act, the owner must connect the electric vehicle charging station to their own electricity utility account unless the licensed contractor performing the installation deems that to be impossible. In this circumstance, the association shall allow the owner to connect the electric vehicle charging station to the common electricity account but may require reimbursement by the owner to the association for the electricity costs, per the owner's responsibility for such costs.
- SECTION 5. An association in the city of Haverhill may install an electric vehicle charging station in the common area for the use of all members of the association and, in that case, the association shall develop appropriate terms of use for the charging station.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect 30 days from its passage.

Memorandum of Agreement Between THE CITY OF HAVERHILL and THE HAVERHILL SUPERIOR OFFICERS GROUP

This Memorandum of Agreement sets forth the agreement of the parties to amend and supplement the existing agreement in effect through June 30, 2025. This Memorandum shall not be binding until ratified by the membership of the Union and funded by City Council. Failing such ratification, or funding, the Memorandum shall not be admissible in any proceeding between the parties.

1. Article XII - Private Paid Details and Overtime
