18. Council Committee Reports and Announcements

Councillor/Chairperson Colin LePage read Minutes and Recommendations for discussion and acceptance of the Administration & Finance Committee meeting held on February 15, 2018.

1.Document 103-E/2017 - Discussion regarding shootings in Haverhill and action taken by HPD specifically **graffiti**. Chief DeNaro attended the meeting and informed that the Police Department has had meetings with gang leaders to dissuade them of this practice. Richard MacDonald, Director, Inspectional Services informed that city has utilized Sheriff's Anti-Graffiti unit to clean public property and has requested waivers from private property owners. This matter has been tabled to the next Administration & Finance Committee to review examples of ordinances from other communities provided by Chief of Staff Heartquist. Graffiti can be reported through 311 Constituent Services.

2. <u>Document 103-Q/2017</u> – Discussion about receipt of City Council meeting minutes. Meeting minutes are being provided to all Councillors prior to meeting. Committee voted to remove this item from Committee Study list, passed unanimously.

3. <u>Document 110-U/2017</u> – Discussion regarding Citizen Inquiry/request referral system. In order to answer citizen requests in timely manner it was suggested the 311 Constituent Services be utilized or an intern be hired for the City Council office. This item will stay on the Committee Study list for future review.

4. <u>Document 7-H</u> – Discussion regarding Rules and Regulations of the City Council. The Rules and Regulations have been referred to City Solicitor for review. On motion of Councillor LePage to table to March 13 City Council meeting. Yeas 8, Nays 0, Absent 1 7H

5. <u>Document 26-E/2017</u> – Discussion regarding Updates/Capital Project Requests from Police & Fire Departments. Deputy Chief informed that 44 window replacements at Police Station will begin in spring with estimated 2 year completion; contract for replacement of radio dispatch system for public safety should be signed shortly; police station generator does not power the entire building and replacement is estimated at \$185,000 and that funding allocation occur in fy2018-2019; Chief Laliberty informed that replacement fire truck is scheduled to be delivered to city by end of March; replacement back-up power generators are needed at all fire stations. This item will be stay on the Committee Study list for future review.

Councillor LePage announced the Administration & Finance Committee meeting scheduled for March 22 has been rescheduled to March 29, at 7:00PM in the City Council office, Room 204.
