Paul Cote, a resident of Amesbury, addressed the council about motorcycle safety and road concerns, noting that Haverhill has the highest number of registered motorcycles in Essex County. He gave statistics of motorcycle incidents. Arlene Willett shared a tragic story of her son who was killed by a texting driver to emphasize the dangers of distracted driving.

Councilors McGonagle, Michitson and Jordan thanked Paul for the awareness of Motorcycle safety. Mayor Barrett read the proclamation into the record.

6.1 Council Vice President Jordan, Councillors Lewandowski, Lepage and Ferreira request to introduce Pat Corr from the *Bradford Swim Club* and Eridania Nieves and Leydi Diaz Breton from GEMS to share with the Council the impact that the grants from the Youth Services & Mental Health had on their organizations and to discuss the future of the YS & MH account now that there is longer ARPA money to fund it.

Patrick Corr, representing Bradford Swim Club addressed the council. He thanked the city for its support through grants that funded swim lessons for children and certified lifeguards, mostly local teenagers. These initiatives aim to improve water safety and prevent drownings. He expressed gratitude for the city's investment in these lifesaving programs.

Eridania Nieves, representing GEMS addressed the Council. Showed a brief presentation slide. Our program provides a safe supportive space for girls to grow, lead and thrive. This March we cohosted our first young woman's leadership conference, reaching over 100 girls.

Leydi Diaz Breton addressed the council. She shared how the youth mental health grant supported impactful programs for young girls. Activities included: health and nutrition education, leadership

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conferences, community service. She introduced two young girls who spoke about their experience with the program.

Mayor Barrett stated she strongly supports the program, and its long-term impact on the youth and community and commits to continued funding.

Councilors voiced strong support for the programs highlighting their role in mental health and leadership. They feel it is important to sustain the funding and praised the youth presenters. This is a commitment the councilors want to continue and grow support for.

Captain Andrea Fogarty, Haverhill Police Department addressed the council. She stated there are ongoing concerns about animal related issues in the downtown area. To tackle these problems a multipronged approach began. Animal control officers visited downtown apartment buildings, distributed educational letters, and established direct lines of communication with property managers. This has improved reporting and targeted enforcement, Coordination with DPW to ensure waste dispensers are maintained. Increased enforcement in key areas like Swasey's Field and the stadium. Continued patrols, public cooperation and property management support are expected to improve compliance.

The Councilors expressed gratitude towards the Police Department for working with downtown business owners on quality of life issues around the dog waste management. They praised the efforts of volunteers who have collected a significant amount of dog waste. Councilor Ferreira suggested more dog waste disposal options. Councilor McGonagle suggested creating a hotline for reporting offenders. There was a an overall sentiment of addressing the issue through education, resources and enforcement.
