Councillor Sullivan read the following resolution into the record;

Resolved: Having convened in an open meeting on March 27, 2018, prior to the SOI submission closing date, the City Council of Haverhill, in accordance with its charter and ordinances, has voted to authorize the Superintendent of Schools to submit to the Massachusetts School Building Authority the Statement of Interest Form dated March 13, 2018 for the Consentino School located at 685 Washington Street, Haverhill, MA 01832, which describes and explains the following deficiencies and the priority category(s) for which an application may be submitted to the Massachusetts School Building Authority in the future to eliminate existing severe overcrowding; and, replacement, renovation or modernization of school facility systems, such as roofs, windows, boilers, heating and ventilation systems, to increase energy conservation and decrease energy related costs in a school facility; and hereby further specifically acknowledges that by submitting this State of Interest Form, the Massachusetts School Building Authority in no way guarantees the acceptance or the approval of an application, the awarding of a grant or any other funding commitment from the Massachusetts School Building Authority, or commits the Haverhill School District to filing an application for funding with the Massachusetts School Building Authority.*

SUPERINTENDENT SCULLY INFORMED THAT HE HAS MET WITH THE STATE SEVERAL TIMES. THE REALITY IS THAT ONLY ONE SCHOOL PROJECT WILL BE APPROVED. HE AGREED THAT THERE IS OVERCROWDING AT J.G. WHITTIER SCHOOL AND THAT OTHER SCHOOLS (TILTON) ARE IN NEED BUT THAT CONSENTINO SCHOOL IS A PRIORITY. HE SUGGESTED THE NEXT STEP WOULD BE TO LOOK AT FINANCES TO JUSTIFY A WAY TO PAY FOR OTHER SCHOOLS. COUNCILLORS EXPRESSED CONCERN THAT THE SOI IS THE SAME ONE THAT WAS PREVIOUSLY SUBMITTED AND REJECTED AND THAT THE CITY HAS TO START LONG RANGE PLANNING TO ADDRESS DEFICIENCIES/NEEDS OF AGING SCHOOLS.

ON MOTION OF COUNCILLOR SULLIVAN AND SECOND BY COUNCILLOR BEVILACQUA TO APPROVE THE STATEMENT OF INTEREST (SOI) FOR THE CONSENTINO SCHOOL ON MOTION OF COUNCILLOR BARRETT AND SECOND BY COUNCILLOR DALY O'BRIEN TO AMEND THE MOTION TO INCLUDE THAT THE MAYOR FORM A SMALL SUB-COMMITTEE CONSISTING OF MAYOR, SUPERINTENDENT, 2 CITY COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVES, 2 SCHOOL COMMITTEE REPRESENTATIVES AND FACILITY MANAGER FOR THE SCHOOLS TO MEET AND PLAN FOR NEEDS OF SCHOOL DEPARTMENT FOR THE NEXT 5-10 YEARS AND THAT THE MOTION ON THE SOI IS CONTINGENT ON PASSING OF THIS AMENDMENT.
